For the last two months in the Jewish calendar we have been looking inward to understand who we are and who we hope to be. This kind of introspection is really never finished.

**This workshop will continue this intense lifelong work by exploring how race impacts all of us in the United States and more importantly how we are commanded to respond to the hate we see all around us.**

Intersectionality is defined by Webster's Dictionary as "the interconnected nature of social categorizations such as race, class, and gender as they apply to a given individual or group, regarded as creating overlapping and interdependent systems of discrimination or disadvantage."

This workshop will turn intersectionality on its head, analyzing how most Americans are both privileged and oppressed at the same time (White Jews, Black Straight Men, Able-bodied White Christian Women). We will look at the historical development of this phenomenon and more importantly its implications for us as a Jewish community and Individual Jews.

This will be a multi-sensory workshop including a Q&A and small group discussions.
